SCN Celebrates The Holiday Season With Made-in-Saskatchewan Programming

Regina, Saskatchewan – The Saskatchewan Communications Network (SCN) is ready for a real ‘home for the Holidays’ family celebration with a slate of made-in-Saskatchewan programs.

Highlights of the Holiday schedule:

Rust – December 24 at 9:00 p.m.

Rust is a heartwarming film for the whole family. It was written and directed by Corbin Bernsen, who also stars in the film along with the whole community of Kipling, Saskatchewan. Bernsen’s character is a former minister who returns to his hometown after suffering a crisis of faith to find the town reeling from a recent tragedy. As he tries to find the truth behind the mysterious fire that rocked the town, he also rediscovers his faith.

Old Elephant’s Christmas – December 24 at 1:00 p.m. and December 25 at 10:00 p.m.

Join Saskatoon storyteller and entertainer Brenda Baker as she presents a small screen adaptation of her popular stage production.

Weekend Wonder – December 27, all three episodes air back-to-back beginning at 9:00 p.m.

Follow the building of a green, energy efficient cabin over a period of three-day period in Buffalo Pound, Saskatchewan.

On December 26, it is all Saskatchewan, all day – from sign-on to sign-off. Notable programming includes:

Wapos Bay – A multiple award-winning children’s series created by Wapos Bay Productions.

Saskatchewan River Delta – 5:00 p.m. – Gemini-nominated documentary exploring one of the largest unbroken wetlands left on Earth.

Everett Baker’s Saskatchewan – 8:00 p.m. – An amateur photographer and field man for the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool. Everett Baker captured the spirit of the people and places of Saskatchewan in stunning Kodachrome images. This is an audience favourite!

Mad Cow, Sacred Cow – 9:00 p.m. – Filmmaker Anand Ramyya embarks on a journey that reveals shocking connections between the Mad Cow crisis, the Farm crisis, and the Global Food crisis.



Pow Wow Thunder – 10:00 p.m. – Take a journey into the lives of veteran Pow-Wow announcers with an intimate look at these versatile personalities.

My Dinner with Generation X – 11:00 p.m. This road-movie documentary mixes candid interviews with nostalgic childhood recreations of the 1970s and vintage slacker footage from the 1980s.

The Neighbors Dog, Little Miss Higgins and Jason Plumb and the Willing – midnight, two concerts back-to-back – House concert episodes starring Jolene Higgins, the pride of Nokomis, Saskatchewan with Foy Taylor, followed by Regina's own Jason Plumb and his band.
